Early in my life, I witnessed the enduring struggle of my mother and grandmother as they aged with chronic debilitating pain. As a bedside nurse, I formed close connections with patients who faced varying degrees of undermanaged pain. Moreover, my role as a researcher has allowed me opportunities to listen and work *with* participants as they shared the exhaustive impact pain had on their overall quality of life. Each of these encounters has fueled my unwavering dedication and aspiration to improve pain outcomes for marginalized groups, specifically middle-aged and older adults from underrepresented backgrounds such as African Americans and individuals with disabilities. Consequently, my career and research mission revolve around addressing the inequities historically faced by these groups in relation to pain-related outcomes.

By becoming a member of the US Association for the Study of Pain (USASP) Board of Directors, I see an opportunity to further advance the cause of equity in pain research and outcomes. I believe equity and inclusion should be the standards not the exceptions.

Throughout my career, I have consistently demonstrated a commitment to health equity, diversity, inclusion, and access through my contributions to research, teaching, and leadership roles. For example, I serve as the Deputy Director of the Johns Hopkins RESILIENCE Center where our mission is to contribute to inclusion and improvement of health outcomes by working with individuals with disabilities and their caregivers. Additionally, I am a member of the USASP Executive Committee for the Pain and Aging SIG. If given the opportunity to serve as a Board Member for the USASP, I will contribute to the organization's overall mission of bringing together diverse perspectives in pain science to enhance the lives of people living with pain. I will bring not only my expertise but also the voices and experiences of underrepresented populations.
